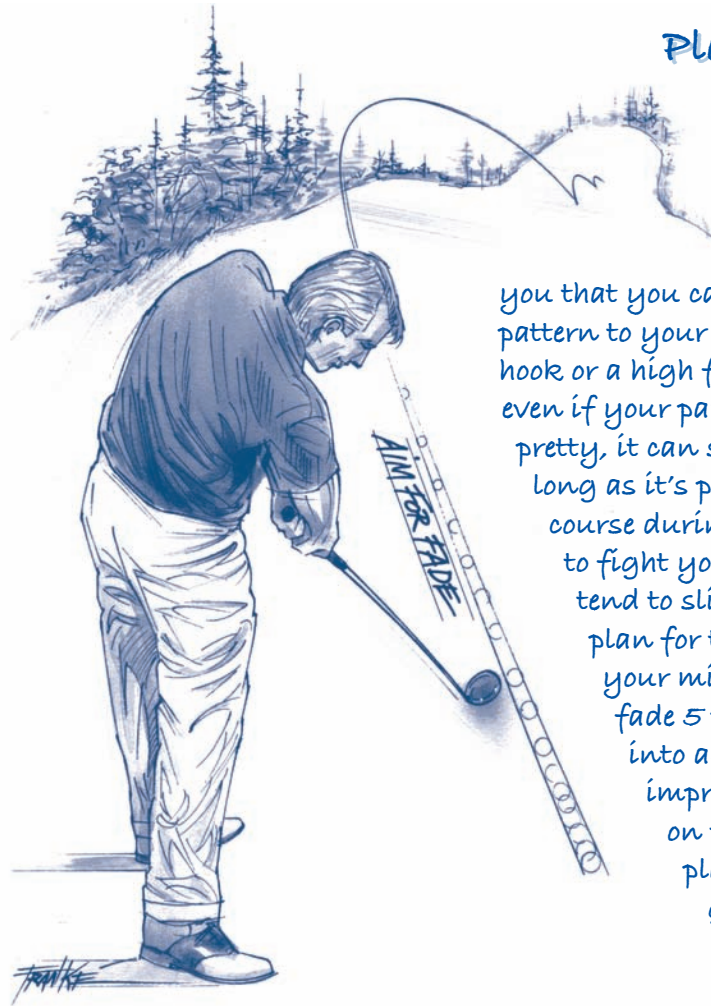

BUILD YOUR GAME

Play "Your" Shot



Every golfer likes to hit the ball long, high and straight, but experience tells

you that you can expect a certain pattern to your shots. It may be a low hook or a high fade. Keep in mind that even if your particular shot isn't pretty, it can still be functional as long as it's predictable. On the course during a match, don't try to fight your shot. If your drives tend to slice 15 to 20 yards, plan for that as you aim. If your middle iron approaches fade 5 to 10 yards, take that into account too. Work on improving your ball flight on the practice tee, but play with what you've got on the course.
