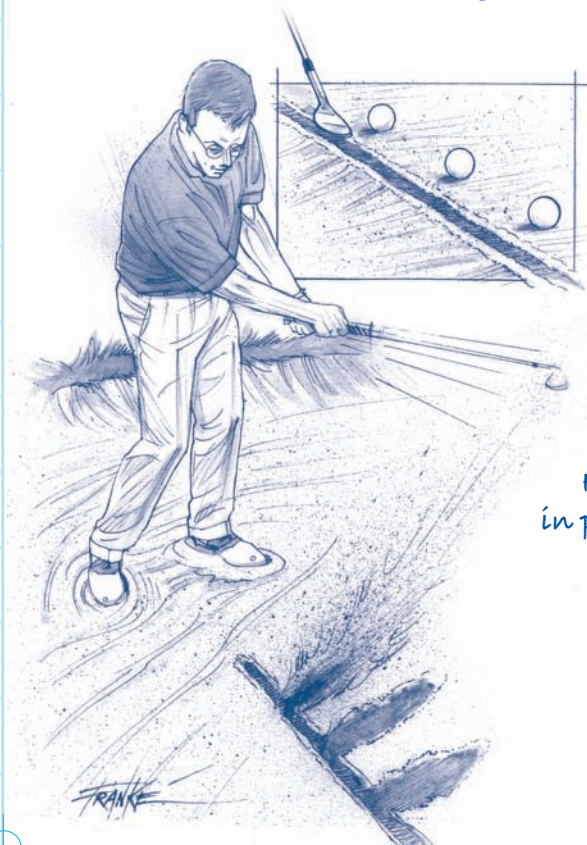

## Pick Your Spot

The most important factor to becoming a consistently good bunker player is the ability to control where the club head enters the sand. To practice that aspect of your sand play, draw a line in the sand a couple inches behind the ball. Then hit a few shots and check where the divot starts in relation to the line. As your ability to hit the line improves, so will your sand play. Then on the golf course, pick a spot (like a grain of sand, pebble or piece of grass) behind the ball, to look at. Hit that spot just like you hit the line in practice.
